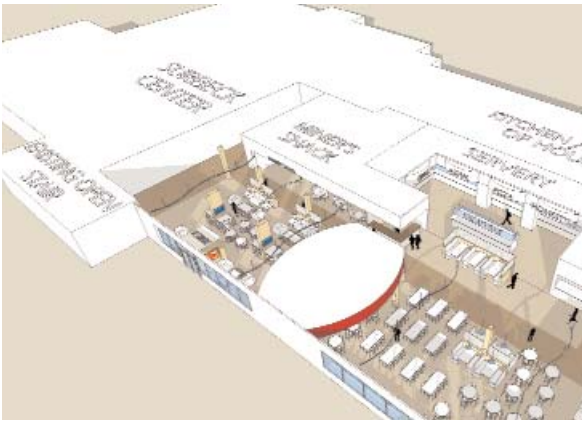


Surbeck Renovation Phase II

- **Square Footage:** 30,000
- **Estimated Cost:** \$6 million
- **Revenue Sources:** \$9.99/credit hour general activity fee increase
- **Why is this project important?** To keep this building viable, aging infrastructure and code compliant issues monitored by the Office of the State Engineer need to be addressed. This renovated facility will strengthen Surbeck's role as the living room for the School of Mines students and alumni as well as the location of choice for campus and community activities for many decades into the future.
- **What needs will this project fulfill?** The plan includes renovating the dining services to include more flexible/useable space; creating more student study and lounge areas that provide computer/tablet support (accessible electrical outlets, enough wireless access points) and comparable furnishings; and the repair and upgrade of all infrastructure.
- **Why is this project unique?** The School of Mines Student Association Senate has been a constant voice to the planning of this project to ensure that the building project fits the needs of the students, is more efficient and provides an enhanced student experience for a better connection with alumni in the years to come. In fall 2007, students voted for a \$9.99 per credit hour increase in student fees to assist in the project. Student body voter turnout was 41 percent, and 64 percent of the students who voted, voted yes.
